

Exemplary Issues to Compare and Analyze Standards	Specificity of Norms Are the rules proposed by the standard specific enough to foster implementation?	Implementability Are the required implementation processes specifically laid out?	Geographic Scope In which countries/regions is the standard primarily used?
	Legitimacy of Norms Was the standard developed in a multi-stakeholder way?	Accountability Does the standard require the creation of accountability processes?	Industry Focus In which industry (or industries) can the standard be used?
